Road Scholar's 2023 Fiscal Year was a year in which our participants re-embraced their love of learning and adventure after the tumultuous years of the pandemic. We provided transformative on-site educational experiences to over 83,000 Road Scholars in FY23.

At heart, what that number really means is Road Scholar is once again making a difference in the lives of older adults. For 78-year-old Linda P., Road Scholar offered companionship and new lifelong friends. For 68-year-old Lorna G., Road Scholar provided a way for her to fulfill her dream in retirement and journey to the depths of the Grand Canyon. For Lydia and Daniel S., Road Scholar opened up a new avenue in their lives to study Spanish abroad. There are many thousands of stories like these among the community of older adult learners we served this past fiscal year.

As we made the world our classroom once again this year, we continued our virtual world of discovery to ensure our community of older adults who were more comfortable learning from home had opportunities for discovery and camaraderie as well. More than 36,000 Road Scholars enjoyed the stimulation of our virtual lectures, while another 1,000 engaged in our multi-day online learning adventures that recreated the Road Scholar experience online, led by Road Scholar instructors from more than 15 countries.

As we continue to emerge from the pandemic, we will expand the depth and breadth of our offerings to include more opportunities for older adults with varying interests and abilities. Looking forward with an eye to our rich past, Road Scholar's 1980 Annual Report perfectly captures the spirit driving our mission ever forward:

There is something about Road Scholar that makes us want to stretch ourselves, to aim a little higher, to reach for that last bit of energy and creativity which will enable the program to serve even more people in a greater variety of ways.

The financial results Road Scholar achieved in FY23 would be extraordinary at any time, but are particularly so following the difficult years of the COVID-19 pandemic.

In pre-pandemic times, Road Scholar offered more than 1,600 unique learning adventures annually, with a total of 6,000 departure dates. That massive program inventory was unwieldy and inefficient, with too many departures cancelled due to insufficient enrollment or operated at a loss, after marketing and overhead costs were applied. Management used the time of the pandemic to painstakingly review each of those 1,600 programs against a number of criteria, including participant satisfaction ratings and financial sustainability. This prompted the suspension of approximately 1,000 programs from Road Scholar's inventory of offerings. Those retained were the most

financially successful, popular and efficient to manage.

As a result, Road Scholar concluded FY23 having operated 3,875 departure dates of 655 unique programs attended by 83,248 participants, an increase of 33,000 participants over the year before, while increasing the organization's net assets from \$16 million at the beginning of the year to \$66 million by the end. Many not-for-profit organizations like Road Scholar are prudently building back their endowments following recent difficult years. After expending more than \$70 million of financial reserves to survive the pandemic, FY23's financial results, and the continued support of our friends who believe in our mission, are a very welcome and encouraging step toward ensuring Road Scholar will be there for generations of lifelong learners to come.
