Drury Plaza Hotel Santa Fe

The 182-room Drury Plaza Hotel in Santa Fe is located in the heart of downtown Santa Fe, just steps away from Santa Fe’s historic Plaza. The primary façade is from the 1950’s St. Vincent’s Hospital and is an excellent example of late Territorial Revival style. The fully renovated buildings are steeped in history, and surrounded by a pedestrian oasis, all in downtown Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Trip Itinerary

Day 1: Sunday, October 21
Arrival, Check-in, Orientation, Welcome Dinner

Day 2: Monday, October 22
Lecture Overview of New Mexico, Free Time

Learn about the history of the area that is now New Mexico, from its earliest Native American inhabitants to the Spanish conquistadors and Anglo settlers who followed. Then, head out on foot to explore Santa Fe’s Plaza area, the historic heart of the city. Visit the impressive Cathedral Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi, the intriguing Loretto Chapel and other sites as time permits. Enjoy a plated meal from a limited menu at Blue Corn Café, a local favorite; selections include some traditional New Mexican dishes as well as non-New Mexican options. Following lunch, the rest of the day is free time for independent exploration of the downtown area. Dinner is on your own to continuing sampling all that Santa Fe has to offer.

Day 3: Tuesday, October 23
Indian Arts Research Center, Chimayo

Following breakfast, enjoy a lecture on the Pueblos of New Mexico by a local expert. Then, head to the School for Advanced Research to explore Indian Arts, including beautiful collections of pottery, weaving, baskets, jewelry and paintings only seen by the public via special invitation. Enjoy lunch at Rancho de Chimayo, a charming restaurant housed in an old hacienda. Lunch will be a plated meal ordering from a special menu featuring traditional New Mexican cuisine, with chips, salsa and a non-alcoholic beverage. After lunch, visit a weaving gallery in Chimayo — Centinela Traditional Arts. Chimayo is home to several families who have been creating Hispanic weavings for generations. Also visit a beautiful little Roman Catholic Church, famous for the story of its founding and as a contemporary pilgrimage site. Dinner will be served at the hotel before an evening at leisure to unwind after a long day.

Day 4: Wednesday, October 24
Georgia O’Keeffe Lecture, Georgia O’Keeffe Museum

Following breakfast, start the morning with a lecture about the life and art of Georgia O’Keeffe. After moving to northern New Mexico in 1949, Ms. O’Keeffe spent the next 26 years producing distinctive and iconic paintings of the area’s landscape, flowers and other regional subjects. After the lecture, walk four blocks to the Georgia O’Keeffe Museum, which holds the largest collection of O’Keeffe’s work in the world. Lunch will be at a popular local restaurant, followed by free time to continue exploring Santa Fe. Dinner is on your own this evening so that you can experience one of Santa Fe’s many fine restaurants.



Day 5: Thursday, October 25
Southwest Cooking Demonstration, Museum Hill

Our day begins with a field trip to Red Mesa Cuisine to enjoy a lecture on Southwest cuisine and a regional cuisine demonstration presented by James Beard Award-winning chefs Lois Ellen Frank and Walter Whitewater. This class will also include a number of Native American traditional foods with contemporary preparation and presentation. For lunch, enjoy the unique dishes that were prepared during the morning presentation. Following lunch, travel back into Santa Fe to Museum Hill for afternoon visits to the Museum of Indian Arts and Culture and the Museum of International Folk Art. Tonight’s farewell dinner will be at La Casa Sena Cantina, a well-known contemporary restaurant in the Sena Plaza compound near the hotel. Choose from several entrees as well as an appetizer or a salad and a specially selected dessert.
